GUIDELINES FOR BOOK REVIEWS

The IJCJSD's book review editors, <u>Professor Avi Brisman and Professor Marília de Nardin Budó</u>, invite scholars to review books.

Reviews should not be descriptive or summarise content but provide a critical evaluation and/or analysis of the book and its contribution to the field. It is not just about the 'what?', but also about the 'so what?' factor of the book.

Reviews should be written for a non-specialist audience and outline the strengths and any weaknesses of the book, taking into account the author/s aims in writing the book and supporting any evaluation of the book with relevant evidence. In evaluating the contribution of the book you might consider the thesis and/or purpose of the book, authors expertise, relationship of the book with other work in its field, use of evidence, its intended audience, its scope and structure.

Book reviews can be considered at any time. A book review may be submitted via **emailing the Book Review Editors** via <u>crimjournal@qut.edu.au</u>

Chief Editors will then review for suitability (in terms of the Journal's themes and scope) and then assign to the Book Review Editor/s and ask them to undertake a review of the submission to determine whether it meets the Book Review quidelines.

Book reviews are a maximum of 1,200 words and are generally not less than 900 words in length.

Please format reviews as follows:

- Double spaced
- 12 times new roman point font
- Submit as a word document
- Avoid use of citations and footnotes

At the top of the review, please provide the following information:

- book author/s,
- publication date,
- title,
- publisher,
- place of publication,
- ISBN.

Please ensure the submission has been proof-read, professionally edited and is publication ready.
